# DYNAMIC NEW RESERVOIR WEB PAGES LAUNCHED

From today SA Water's website will be home to new, dynamic pages with information on Adelaide's reservoir holdings.

SA Water Chief Operating Officer John Ringham said the new pages aimed to improve water literacy for SA Water customers by providing more detailed information encompassing the metropolitan water supply system as a whole.

"One of the most common requests for information from our customers relates to our reservoirs, and this new page will ensure they can receive consistent and relevant information," Mr Ringham said.

Users of the site will notice new features such as:

- State maps, including locations of reservoirs
- Total reservoir holding percentage and associated data
- Daily metropolitan consumption levels

"Not only do the pages include links to information on the reservoirs which supply Adelaide with its water, but also links to the Murray-Darling Basin Commission's interstate storages at Dartmouth and Hume Reservoirs - which our State's River system relies upon," Mr Ringham said.

"With the click of a button, people can now check out metropolitan water storages including a map of where the reservoirs are located, links to regional water supply data and rainfall data across the State.

Visitors to the website can also view up-to-date data on individual reservoirs, including graphs which compare current storages with the five-year average.

"Put simply this is an easy way for our customers to understand where our water comes from and how much we have in storage."
